

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR
THE USE OF PUBLIC PARKLAND
FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

The Brushy Creek Regional Utility Authority (BCRUA) Board of Directors will hold a public hearing on February 19, 2008, at 7:00 p.m. at the Round Rock City Hall Building, 221 East Main St., Round Rock, Texas, to consider the use of dedicated public parkland for the following purposes:

The BCRUA's proposed creation of a new regional water supply system ("Project") will involve the use or taking of some public parkland that is owned or controlled by the Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA), Travis County, and the City of Cedar Park. A raw water pipeline will be constructed through some parts of Sandy Creek Park in Travis County and a treated water pipeline and raw water pipeline will be constructed through part of Cedar Park's Northwest Community Park. The public hearing will be to consider (a) whether there is no feasible and prudent alternative to the use or taking of the Sandy Creek Park easements and the Northwest Park easements; (b) whether the Project includes all reasonable planning to minimize harm to the Sandy Creek Park easements and the Northwest Park easements as a park, recreation area, scientific area, wildlife refuge, or historic site, resulting from the use or taking; and (c) BCRUA's formal approval of the Project.

The Public Hearing will be part of the scheduled meeting of the BCRUA Board of Directors.
